Background on Nursing-Legal Partnership

### POPULATION LEVEL MEASURES IN MATERNAL-CHILD HEALTH

- Infant Mortality Rate (IMR) [Most Common, Desired]
  - Number of deaths between birth and one year of age per 1,000 live births.

**NFP** 

PAT

Proximal: Preterm Birth Rate, Low Birth Weight, Birth Defects, SIDS



- ▶ Distal (Diagnostic): Depression (PHQ-9/EPDS), Domestic Violence (AAS/PVS), Obesity (BMI), STI (Screenings)
- ▶ Distal (Behavioral): Alcohol Use, Anxiety/Stress, Breastfeeding Initiation/Duration, Diet, Folic Acid Use, Physical Activity, Smoking/Tobacco Use, Substance Abuse
- ▶ BUT... there are many other issues that impact these distal and proximal measures as well.

EXAMPLES OF HOW UNMET NEEDS IMPACT MATERNAL-CHILD HEALTH

Substandard Housing: Mold, roaches, inadequate heating, etc. linked to asthma-related ER visits.


Legal Status: Fear and limited knowledge on how to access public benefits for legally present non-citizens... and so families go without services.

Pregnancy-Related
Discrimination: Unjustifiably forced to reduce hours or even become unemployed due to pregnancy.

These, as well as others, require legal assistance.

#### PHILADELPHIA AND NFP/MM

These unmet legal needs are particularly present in Philadelphia:

- ▶ Poorest of the top ten largest cities in the nation.
- Second poorest congressional district in nation.
- ► High rate of "deep poverty".
- ➤ 26% population income under federal poverty guidelines.

#### Philadelphia NFP/MM Clients:

- ► Live in most distressed neighborhoods.
- Decaying housing stock.
- ► Limited access to healthy foods.
- Widespread violence/crime.
- ► High school dropout rate of 45 to 50 percent.



### STEPS TO ADDRESS THESE ISSUES

Pew Foundation and United Way grants for Social Services Coordinator.

- Focus on improving housing conditions for clients and reducing "couch surfing" and shelter placements.
- Six years of funding.

#### However...

- "Clout" missing despite squeaky wheel approach!
- Need for legal interventions and policy changes.
- Staff need for skill building to focus on program implementation and reduce time/effort spent on "legal" challenges.

## UNIQUE CHARACTERISTICS OF NLP

- ► Disruptive model to current healthcare system.
- ► Nurses and attorneys co-lead intervention.
- ► Builds on Public Health Nurse scope of practice.
- ► Advocacy, policy development, planning.
- ► Application of theory, practice, and evidence-based outcomes.



### NUTS AND BOLTS OF THE PROJECT

- ► I-HELP Assessment (Will Discuss).
  - ► All NFP participants are screened with I-HELP periodically.
  - ► I-HELPs are forwarded to legal team for evaluation.
  - Client Screening administered by NFP nurse.
  - ► Authorizes NFP/PAT to share information with NLP.
- Legal Screening / Merit Evaluation.
- Case Conference.
- ▶ I-HELP Acknowledgment.
  - ▶ Offer of representation.
  - Brief advice and counsel with nurse or client.
  - Reject case and refer to outside resources.

#### I-HELP: CATEGORIZES UNMET LEGAL NEEDS

Income: Access to benefits, health insurance.	
Housing: Landlord issues, housing conditions.	
Education: Discrimination based on learning ability.	
Legal Status: Immigration status.	
Personal and Family Safety: Safety of family.	

#### TRAININGS ON MLP



- Trainings on MLP by legal staff to home visitors.
- Idea is to (1) empower home visitors to help clients with less complex legal issues and (2) reduce time for remediation of unmet legal needs.
- Training topics have included:
  - Immigration and Legal Status.
  - Employment-Based Discrimination.
  - Personal and Family Safety.
- Evaluation of trainings on satisfaction and comfort of home visitors in their role and legal needs.

(n=25)




#### Satisfaction of Aspects of Job, April 2018

Issues with domestic violence and/or family safety.


Issues involving accessing education for a child with a learning disability.

Issues with employment-based discrimination (e.g., employer treating client differently since she is pregnant).

Housing issues (e.g., difficult landlord, insects, mold, etc.).

Issues with immigration and/or legal status.

Issues accessing Medical Assistance, SSI, and/or WIC.



#### HOW THE NLP IS ASSESSED

- Remember: I-HELP integrated into evidencebased home visiting.
  - Philadelphia NFP: Screen on life course (TC Age, Start Date).
  - PAT/MM: Screen every 4 months (April, August, December)
- NFP and PAT continue to use their program tools:
  - Philadelphia NFP: Strengths and Risks (STAR)
  - ► PAT/MM: Life Skills Progression (LSP)
- Why this design?
  - Allows tracking of measures over time for all clients.
  - ► Tracks the reported unmet legal needs.
  - Balances data burden with project needs.



## EVALUATION METHODS

Ongoing process based on how the data collected has evolved over time.

Propensity score matching.

Match NLP+ and NLP- clients on their propensity to be enrolled in the NLP based on age, race/ethnicity, and zip code of residence.

► Run NFP and PAT/MM separately.

Only include NLP+ clients who had their legal case or consultation closed between two assessments.



#### **CURRENT RESULTS: NFP STAR DOMAINS**
