


The National Nurse-Led Care Consortium (NNCC) is a non-profit membership organization that supports nurse-led care and nurses at the front lines of care.






COVID-19 UPDATES & RESOURCES

As a result of a court order, effective immediately and as of April 18, 2022, CDC's January 29, 2021 Order requiring masks on public transportation conveyances and at transportation hubs is no longer in effect. Therefore, CDC will not enforce the Order. CDC continues to recommend that people wear masks in indoor public transportation settings at this time. Total Population

85% of Asian, 65% of Hispanic, and 63% of White people had received at **least one COVID-19 vaccine dose**, higher than the rate for Black people (57%).

The proportion of Black and Hispanic people who received a **booster shot** was lower compared to White people. Findings for Asian people are mixed. 38 States + D.C.

Vaccinating Children with Disabilities Against COVID-19

Physical ease of access

- Schedule longer appointment times so children feel comfortable before, during, and after vaccination.
- If possible, allow children to get vaccinated in their caregiver's vehicle.

Sensory ease of access

- Make sensory modifications where needed. Some children may be sensitive to light, sounds, smells, or physical touch that vaccination requires.
- If possible, offer a separate, "quiet room" away from crowds.



Children are allowed by law to have their service animal accompany them at COVID-19 vaccination sites.





COVID-19 VACCINATIONS: SAFE AND EFFECTIVE







COVID-19 is still infecting thousands of people every day including elderly, adults, teens and children, Regardless of whether masks are required in your area, you and your family will be safest if you wear a mask.

Masks protect against COVID-19

Because COVID-19 spreads very easily, wearing a mask protects you, your friends and family, and your community.

Nhen you wear a mask, it is less likely that you will get sick from breathing in the virus if it is in the air.

It is possible to be sick with COVID-19 and not know it, because not everyone feels sick. In this case, wearing a mask makes it less likely that you will spread the virus to others.

MASKS MUST BE WORN PROPERLY TO F **BE EFFECTIVE**

· Wear your mask over your · Do not touch your mask nose and mouth when it is on your face · Make sure no air leaks out Clean your reusable mask the top or sides at least daily · Put your mask on and off with clean hands only once

· Use your disposable mask



most protection Getting vaccinated is the most

important step for you to take to protect yourself and your community.

After getting fully vaccinated it is unlikely you will get sick from COVID-19, and even if you do, the vaccine will protect you from getting dangerously ill.

EVEN VACCINATED PEOPLE ARE SAFEST WITH A MASK

It is uncommon for people to get sick with COVID-19 after they are vaccinated, but it can happen.

Getting a vaccine and wearing a mask are the best ways to avoid getting sick and spreading COVID-19 to others.

HERE ARE SOME OF OUR FINDINGS...

The majority of surveyed individuals who received the vaccine at our clinic identified as Nepali.

The majority of surveyed individuals who were unvaccinated identified as Ka'ren.

The most common way that surveyed individuals received information about the vaccine was through word of mouth.

The most common reason for delaying vaccination was fear of side effects.



HERE ARE SOME OF OUR FINDINGS...

The majority of surveyed individuals who were unvaccinated were female and the main caregiver of the family.

Their responsibilities to the family prevented them from leaving the house or scheduling a vaccine appointment.


