


The National Nurse-Led Care Consortium (NNCC) is a non-profit membership organization that supports nurse-led care and nurses at the front lines of care.












COVID-19 Deaths Associated With Underlying Conditions







Tips for Managing Chronic Diseases

You don't have to go at it alone. Find an accountability partner to hold you accountable for managing your chronic disease.

I Have Diabetes

Black adults are 60% more likely to be diagnosed with diabetes. Managing diabetes and helping your loved ones manage theirs is a key step in preventing COVID-19. When people with diabetes do not properly manage their blood sugar levels, they weaken their chances of fighting off COVID-19. People with poorly controlled diabetes are more likely to become very ill and/or die from COVID-19.

Here's what you can do:

- · Stay on top of monitoring your blood sugar regularly and take your medications regularly, as directed
- Contact your physician and request an emergency supply of medications
- Choose healthy food options that don't spike your blood sugar
- Increase your physical activity, consider at least 30 minutes of physical activity per day
- Create a plan to stop smoking, as smoking increasing your chance of having a heart attack or stroke










