2020-21 Year of the Nurse and Midwife

- Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, nurses have played a critical role as frontline caregivers, leaders, and educators. With the rollout of COVID-19 vaccines across the U.S., nurses continue to support the pandemic response.
- In Dec. 2020, the World Health Organization extended the International Year of the Nurse and Midwife from 2020 through 2021.

- Processes and policies that lead to vaccine development, licensure or authorization, manufacturing, and recommendations for use."



Americans' Willingness to Receive Coronavirus Vaccine

— % Yes — % No




% Yes for Jan. 25-31, 2021, includes 9% who have already received at least one dose of the vaccine.

Survey of U.S. Nurses (Oct. 2020)

Survey of 13,000 nurses by American Nurses Foundation

- 44% of nurses are not comfortable having conversations with their patients about COVID-19 vaccines
- However, 65% have provided direct care to patients with a known or suspected case of COVID-19

On whether they would voluntarily be vaccinated against COVID-19 "yes" (34%), "no" (36%), and "unsure" (31%)



Kaiser Family Foundation (Jan. 2021)

COVID-19 Vaccine Monitor data

Among those who have not been vaccinated:

- ~80% of U.S. adults say they would turn to a nurse, doctor, or other health care provider when deciding whether to get a vaccination.
- However, only 24% of those say they have already asked a health care professional for information about the vaccine.
