- Direct, nurse-led healthcare services





COVID-19 Vaccine Resources

- KFF COVID-19 Vaccine Monitor: June 2021
- The latest KFF COVID-19 Vaccine Monitor:
- Unvaccinated adults cite a variety of reasons why they have not gotten a COVID-19 vaccine, with half citing worries about side effects and the newness of the vaccine as major reasons (53% each).
- Other major reasons include just not wanting to get the vaccine (43%), not trusting the government (38%), thinking they do not need the vaccine (38%), not believing the COVID-19 vaccines are safe (37%), and not trusting vaccines in general (26%).

Not sure how or where to get the vaccine	5%	0%
Worried they will have to pay to get the vaccine	5%	0%

- Mean household income in Topeka = \$46,980

- ❖ Poverty rate in US =13.7%
- **❖** Poverty (Topeka) = 16.7%
- Children living in poverty = 14.8% (state); 17.5%(Topeka)




