Big Picture

- Justice Involved Populations Are No Different from Others
- Exacerbating Existing Criminal Justice System Issues
- Policy Shifts are Creating Unpredictable Conditions
- Justice Involved Populations with Pre-existing Health Conditions are a Particular Concern
- May Be Higher Risk for COVID-19 Exposure
- Risk of Misinformation
