64 legal cases closed.

223 legal consultations

conducted.



LESSONS LEARNED

- Legal generalists versus specialists.
- Role clarity between staff social workers and attorneys.
- Identify who is the client (families served versus the organization).
- Identifying and addressing ethical issues.
- Training lawyers to work in health care settings.

EMILY'S STORY

Background


- Mom with quadriplegia
- 22-month old daughter with deafness
- Family lives in Public Housing Authority (PHA) housingan old row house in Philadelphia
 - Outdoor wheelchair lift
 - Multiple units in building
- Mom is very happy with the neighborhood, and has been able to piece together supports for her and her daughter's unique medical needs

Health-harming legal issue

 Outdoor wheelchair lift is breaking, due to parts needing replacement as well as neighborhood vandalism

EMILY'S STORY: HOW IS THIS HEALTH-HARMING?

- Inability to get to doctor's appointments for mother and child due to being unable to leave home.
- Old housing stock concerns about being trapped in home in case of a fire.
- If family must move, they will likely end up in a different neighborhood, resulting in a loss of the support system they have worked so hard to build may have to switch physicians, therapists, etc.
- Getting locked out of home if family returns to home and lift is broken, they are not able to enter home, meaning that they could be stuck outside for hours waiting for emergency repair in snow or in 100-degree heat.



EMILY'S STORY: LEGAL SOLUTION

Legal solution: housing transfer

- Couldn't client have requested this on her own?
 - Yes, but ...
- The importance of clientcentered advocacy
- Collaborative, interdisciplinary work is key for best outcome


Advocacy efforts are aligned with needs of clients and program domains

DEVELOPING A POLICY TEAM



- The Policy Team was formed to create a Policy Agenda that was client centered, relying on nurse home visitors' experiences and expertise and informed by clients' voices.
- Comprised of nurse home visitors, administrators, supervisors, lawyers, interns, NNCC staff, and program partners.
- Initial Policy Agenda translated into partnerships with local politicians, community leaders, and city agencies leading to tangible outcomes.

- Flexibility and prioritizing.


Families Served in Philadelphia, 2018

nurses had in our communities in 2018.










POLICY EXAMPLE: COALITION FOR A LEAD-FREE PHILLY

- Submitted testimony for families injured by lead poisoning.
- Two nurses testified at hearings and participated in press conferences.
- One client testified, was interviewed by reporters and spoke at a press conference.
- Working with local and state legislators on multiple bills.
